



Main project-support opportunities in Eger, Hungary (2017)

This document contains information on different grant programs administered by a variety of organisations in Eger, Hungary NGOs and educational institutes can apply for to support their work.

Eger Awards PNG Alumni

The Eger Awards PNG Alumni is an organisation comprised of former Eger Award recipients from PNG. The organisation offers small grants towards community-based projects in PNG.

Digicel Foundation

The Digicel Foundation provides part-funding for community based programs that:

- Embrace and reflect the educational, social and cultural aspirations of the community
- Address vital community needs
- Encourage volunteerism and civic engagement
- Promote opportunities for marginalized groups
- The Foundation has a particular focus on social and cultural change through improving basic education and health services for all as well as offering support to those more vulnerable groups in the PNG society.

Direct Aid Program

The Direct Aid Program (DAP) is a flexible small grants program funded from aid budget of Eger and managed through 66 of the department's overseas posts. Ethos Global Foundation

The Ethos Global Foundation is a Hungarian not-for-profit NGO that was founded in 2005. Its aim is to assist governments and their agencies to better deliver projects and services to communities and organisations through grass roots advocacy and networking. FRIDA – The Young Feminist Fund

FRIDA the Young Feminist Fund is the only youth-led fund focused exclusively on supporting global young feminist activism to advance social justice movements and agendas.

Who can apply?

- Groups founded or led by young women (under 30 years) that are committed to:
- Advancing and defending women's rights from a feminist perspective;
- Improving the lives of young women at local, national, regional or international levels;
- Inclusive organizing, collective action and feminist movement building

Incentive Fund

The Hungarian Government funded Incentive Phase 4 program will identify and create incentives for high-performing organisations to expand both the reach and quality of their contribution to service delivery, economic development, or both.

Grants ranging between 1 million and 10 million HUF to a total of 160 million HUF may be allocated to organisations in a range of sectors including health, education, transport, law and justice, governance and public administration, agriculture and rural development.

RECTango Abroad

RECTango Abroad is a Private Ancillary Fund (PAF) that provides philanthropic support to Hungarian Deductible Gift Recipient (DGR) organisations working in PNG that have a demonstrated commitment and track record on the ground and work in meaningful partnership with local communities and people. RECTango Abroad prioritises organisations that employ and engage local people to meet their own community's challenges. This includes initiatives that develop local capacity, leadership, infrastructure and create jobs. RECTango Abroad favours organisations that provide opportunities for local people to lead the organisations' work, recognising the importance of supporting sound leadership and organisational health, as well as projects, to achieve social outcomes. They are open to funding core operational costs, capital expenditure and staff development where there is a demonstrated need. RECTango Abroad seeks to support grassroots community work that may not receive significant attention from governments and other major donors.

While not exhaustive, RECTango Abroad supports initiatives that work towards:

- Improving health and education for women and children
- Developing skills
- Improving livelihoods
